Up to now we have offered 2 levels of courses in taxation. Taxation 101 is for front-line staff dealing with collections. Taxation 201 is offered at Boot Camp for new finance officers. This workshop, Taxation 301, is for those responsible for the taxation function and those who deal with the more complex issues that apply to assessments, calculations and collections.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES:

The objectives of this workshop are to identify the issues involved in property taxation in British Columbia. It will give participants a framework and tools to address not only these issues; but those that may arise in the future.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND:

Finance Officers, Taxation Managers, those with overall responsibility for collecting property taxes in the municipality and staff who deal with more complex issues in the areas of assessment, calculations and collections.
